The Walk to Emmaus develops Christian disciples and leaders by inspiring, challenging, and equipping active adult church members for Christian action in their homes, churches, workplaces, and communities. It also benefits less active members who are seeking to renew a relationship with God, grow spiritually, or discover firmer foundations for their lives.

Through The Walk to Emmaus, as they seek to become healthy and vital congregations, local churches have both a means of growing disciples and a tool for developing leaders for their disciple-making systems.

The program begins with a 72-hour short course in Christianity that is wrapped in prayer and signs of sacrificial service. It continues for the rest of participants' lives with follow-up groups that, along with the local church's robust offerings, contribute to participants' ongoing growth in grace.

What Melora Newsome Had to Say About Her Emmaus Weekend

I had the privilege of attending the Emmaus Women's Walk 112 in July. This was an experience I never thought about attending and I was in prayer about it for a while. I was scared to leave my family alone for a weekend with no way to contact me, but if you can believe it I gave up my phone for a whole weekend. For a whole 72 hours I was cut off from everything in the outside world and it was not easy.

But for 72 hours I was loved by a group of amazing women, who loved without any judgements or cares about what your past was. These women are amazing in their faith of God. They spend a whole weekend of spoiling me with food, special presents called agape gifts and some loving prayers.

I learned about women who lost everything to find out God still loved them no matter what they did, and women who needed God to show them the way home and he did. This week God was there in full force with the Holy Spirit doing step by step on my heart and many others. I made some amazing friends this weekend who I will keep in my heart always.

It is always hard to give up control and put it in God's hands this weekend, but I did it and so can you, if you choose to.

God was with me all weekend, as I prayed for my family to be okay without me, yes I know it was only one weekend and my kids where fine. I prayed for my friends who were back home having some tough times, I prayed for my sister who was with me this weekend and lost her father-in-law while she was there. I prayed for my small group who was not as close with their family as I was. I prayed for my pastor who always needs prayers, my church friends and their families.

I prayed for my closeness to God to get closer, for him to guide my choices, for him to lead me where I needed to be, for his will to be done. This was a weekend I shall never forget. A chance as being close with God I shall always have.

Ways You Can Support Parkview Church



Parkview does not have a full-time paid custodian. We are currently paying several people for a few hours of work each week and depending on volunteers for all the cleaning.

Please see Patti Rang if you are able to assist. with light cleaning, such as dusting blinds and window sills, washing windows, helping with vacuuming, and cleaning the pew chairs.

Many tasks indoor and out are required to maintain our Church. All skill levels and ages can assist.

If you see something in the building or on the church grounds that needs maintenance, there are maintenance work request forms in the lobby. Fill out and drop in the hanging file folder in front of the office door. We have a pile of work order requests that need to be completed currently, and we need volunteers to help with those orders. **Please speak with Chris Marcott if you are able to help.**

We will also be looking for volunteers for mowing this spring and summer. Chris Marcott has a mowing calendar on the main bulletin for sign ups. Please add your name to the calendar and list the section of the yard you are able to mow.

**Items we currently need donated: box cutters, weed trimmers, weed spray. Donations will be labeled as church property and kept in the maintenance room.

Tithing on your required minimum distribution:

If you were 72 before 2020 and have an IRA or 401K, won't you think about donating a portion to the church. Thank you all for being so faithful with your tithes and offerings. This is an easy way to increase your contributions without actually outputting dollars.

Please check with your financial advisor to determine how you may want to handle your RMD (Required Minimum distribution) this year. It has been a very good way to provide a tax exempt contribution to the church. Hopefully, you may want to consider this option, depending on your circumstance.

Rules changed for those who were not 71.5 in 2019. The new age requirement is now 72 for (RMD).







Publicity Deadlines

The success of any event is in part dependent on how well we spread the word. Parkview Church has several options for publicizing church events including:

- The monthly Church Newsletter
- Social Media (Facebook/Instagram)
- Church Website
- Bulletin and spoken announcements, Flyers, etc.

We recommend starting your publicity at least 8 weeks before the event.

Each publicity option has a separate deadline:

- Newsletter 1 week before the end of the month (24th for a 31 day month) We recommend having something in the newsletter 2 months prior to your event.
- Social Media/Website at least 6 weeks before event for an effective advertising

Bulletin/Announcement - 10 am Wednesday (Holidays may impact this deadline). Spoken announcements are not guaranteed and limited to increase effectiveness.

Youth Mission Trip-

The youth (and many adults) travelled to North Carolina in July to Glean fields and learn how to get food from the field to the table.

How much food was that?

Monday: 77 pounds blueberries

Tuesday: Corn- 12,786 pounds of corn Cantaloupe - 11,490 pounds

Wednesday: 1071 lbs of potatoes and sorted 62 crates. My estimate would be at least 25 lbs a crate and most looked to be much more.
